- All persons whose names are entered upon the Church Electoral Roll of the parish (and such persons only) are entitled to vote at the election of parochial representatives of the laity.
- Subject to the provisions of rule 14(3)(c), a person is qualified to be elected a parochial representative of the laity if:
  - (a) his/her name is entered on the Church Electoral Roll of the parish;
  - (b) s/he is an actual communicant (which means that s/he has received Communion according to the use of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with the Church of England at least three times during the twelve months preceding the date of the election); and
  - (c) s/he is of eighteen years or upwards (for election to the deanery synod) or of sixteen years or upwards (for election to the parochial church council); and
  - (d) s/he is not disqualified as referred to in paragraph 3 of these Notes.
- 3. (a) A person shall be disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a churchwarden, a member of the parochial church council, or any synod under these rules if s/he is disqualified from being a charity trustee under section 72(1) of the Charities Act 1993 and the disqualification is not for the time being subject to a general waiver by the Charity Commissioners under subsection (4) of that section or to a waiver by them under that subsection in respect of all ecclesiastical charities established for purposes relating to the parish concerned. (In this paragraph 'ecclesiastical charity' has the same meaning as that assigned to that expression in the Local Government Act 1894);
  - (b) A person shall also be disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a churchwarden or member of a parochial church council if s/he has been so disqualified from holding office under section 10(6) of the Incumbents (Vacation of Benefices) Measure 1977.
