We may not often see teenagers in our Sunday services (they tend to make their way to Lechlade or Cirencester), but we're very pleased that a number of them attend the church-run youth group in Quenington each week.

It was good to be able to support the young people in their piece of practical Christian service, and I'm eager that in the CHEQS churches we find other ways of this sort of putting our faith into practice. So please let me know if there's a charitable cause that you'd like to help promote through church – a local food-bank perhaps, or Christian Aid's work overseas.

FAIRFORD SURGERY – ‘GOOD’

“Services provided by Hilary Cottage Surgery are well led, safe, effective, caring and responsive to people’s needs”

The staff at our local surgery are quietly pleased with the wide-ranging praise they have received. The Care Quality Commission judged the practice to be ‘good’ in all key areas inspected. The inspection, which included interviews with patients and scrutiny of the 2014 national GP patient survey, found that:

- ☑ Patients said they were treated with compassion, dignity and respect. This reflected the surgery’s performance in the 2014 national GP patient survey – 87% of patients said the GP treated them with care and concern.
- ☑ Patients’ care and treatment was delivered in line with best practice standards and guidelines. The practice also met nationally recognised standards for improving patient care and maintaining quality, comparing favourably with other practices in the area.
- ☑ Patients were cared for in an environment which was clean and had appropriate nationally recognised infection control practices in place.
- ☑ The practice had systems to identify, monitor and evaluate risks to patients. Patients were protected from the risks of unsafe medicine management procedures and the practice was judged to have the appropriate equipment, medicines and procedures to manage foreseeable patient emergencies.
- ☑ There was outstanding practice in relation to the dispensary. The practice has a system in place to assess the quality of the dispensing process and has signed up to the Dispensing Services Quality Scheme.
- ☑ The practice works with other health care providers to enable prompt treatment, reduce hospital admissions and enabled patients to be treated at home.

The three areas to improve were no surprise to the team at Hilary Cottage Surgery. Feedback from patients had ensured that work had already begun to address:

1. Waiting time for some appointments: patients were able to speak to or see a GP if they required an urgent appointment, however *“some patients told us they were concerned there was a wait of three to four weeks to see the GP of choice and appointments often ran late”*. *NEW: using a rolling-release system, patients can now find additional slots made available each day.*
2. Patient privacy and confidentiality: this was not easily maintained in the reception and waiting area. *Meetings are taking place to review space and access.*
3. The completion of significant event records: ensuring *all* staff are enabled to attend meetings to discuss concerns, ideas and learning from events which affect their practice. *Already under review*
