

FROM THE VICAR

As indicated in recent editions of this magazine, the clergy allocation across our twenty-two church team (of which our churches are five) has now been agreed – and, as expected, there are implications for us here in CHEQS.

With the reduction in our Team Vicar establishment from seven to six, I've agreed to take on three further churches for the time being at least – Kempsford, Whelford and Castle Eaton. This will happen in early June, following Jean Brown's retirement at Pentecost.

After three months of my being responsible for eight churches (with the able assistance of Lynn Hayler, an experienced curate in our Team), I shall from the beginning of September share the oversight of the CHEQS churches with Andrew Cinnamond, who will also continue with his existing ministry in Lechlade church. So from that point CHEQS will have two Team Vicars, myself and Andrew – responsible for the western (CHQ) and eastern (ES) halves of the group respectively.

The whole thing will be more-or-less invisible to the naked eye. CHEQS will continue to function as a group much as it does now, for example with this excellent magazine – and the individual parishes, with their worship preferences and patterns, can continue unchanged. Most of what I currently do in Eastleach and Southrop will be done by Andrew, or by other ministers from Lechlade ... but that should be no disadvantage. Indeed it should actually improve one or two things (for example the connections between E & S children & teenagers with the excellent youth provision that Lechlade church is able to offer).

I have a very high regard for Andrew as a pastor and preacher, and am entirely confident that he will be able to help our parishes develop as effective Christian communities in the years ahead. I shall still be here of course, and as I work alongside Andrew I look forward to keeping in touch, one way or the other, with all of you into the future.

Easter is a time of new life and new beginnings. We look forward to that being apparent in the next phase of our life as churches in CHEQS.

On a lighter note, the new School Council are organising a ‘Hatherop’s Got Comedy’ afternoon to raise money for Red Nose Day. And finally, on the last day of term, Friday 7th April at 9.30 am, we will be holding an Easter Service at Hatherop church to which all are welcome.

CHURCHWARDEN VACANCY



RESULTS OF THE SPEED WATCH IN QUENINGTON

The results of the first Speed Watch surveys undertaken in Quenington (Coneygar Road on 20 Feb and Fairford Road on 22 Feb) confirm that we do have a serious problem and there is plenty of room for improvement, particularly at Coneygar Road. That said, this was our first survey within the village and it was clearly a surprise for many drivers seeing us out for the first time. In the one hour survey period we observed 28 vehicles: 13 were exceeding the 30 mph limit, with three doing 39 mph, one doing 40 mph and one doing 44mph.

In contrast it was pleasing to see so many drivers seemingly more aware and hence driving more considerately on the Fairford Road just a few days later. Here we observed 45 vehicles: 10 were exceeding the speed limit with five doing 34 mph, one doing 35mph, one doing 38mph and one doing 44mph.

We are greatly encouraged by this and the knowledge that our Speed Watch efforts are very much the hot topic around the district. Judging by the smiles, waves and comments we have had from motorists and or villagers the general reception for it has been very positive which is most gratifying and you can look forward to seeing us out and about on your behalf during March. Safe driving!

HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

The week leading up to Easter is one of the most special for Christians; and all churches, including here in CHEQS, have extra services – for details see elsewhere in the magazine.

The week starts with **Palm Sunday**, when we remember the entry of Jesus to Jerusalem, riding on a donkey and greeted by crowds waving palm branches. *Services on this day often involve processions, and the giving of palm crosses.*

For each of the next three days, in **Holy Week**, Jesus taught in Jerusalem, leaving the city at night to stay with friends nearby for fear of being arrested. *Our churches have a short service of Communion each day, with the Gospel readings following the events.*

On **Maundy Thursday** Jesus didn't leave the city at nightfall, but stayed for a 'Last Supper' with his friends, before going to pray in the Garden of Gethsemane ... where he was arrested. *Our services recall that supper, the forerunner of our Holy Communion services, and sometimes include the washing of feet (as Jesus did) and are sometimes followed by a vigil – a time of silent prayer – remembering Jesus' betrayal and arrest.*

On **Good Friday** we remember Jesus' death on the cross. *We hold an extended service of meditation and prayer, and also an event for children.* Then on **Easter Eve** Jesus "rested in the tomb"; *in a late-evening service we keep watch at the graveside.*

Finally on **Easter Day** we celebrate that God's love is stronger than death itself, in the glorious resurrection of Jesus from the dead – not brought back to life, but breaking through to the new life beyond the grave that God now offers to us all. *All our churches hold services of celebratory worship.*

HATHEROP CASTLE SCHOOL

STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) continue to thrive at Hatherop Castle, with our Lego Robotics team enjoying success again this year. In February, the Lego Robotics team attended the FIRST Lego League UK and Ireland Final in Bristol, having won the regional tournament in Newbury in January.

The team have worked since September to build and program their own robot that completes a number of given challenges in a two-and-a-half minute game.

The final in Bristol saw the best forty-eight teams in the country gather to try to win a place in the final in the USA this summer.

During the day, the team set up their pit area to highlight their project topic and then completed 3 robot games, a ‘core values’ session which focussed on the team work and collaboration shown by the team, a robot design session where the team presented the innovative programming and robot building they had completed, as well as a project presentation based on this year’s ‘Animal Allies’ theme.

The team were excited to be featured on the FIRST Lego League’s live TV stream a number of times, where they were interviewed and featured during the games and when working in the pit areas. Harry was even invited into the on-site TV studio where he commentated on the third of the robot games for the live stream.

The team were complemented on their work on core values where the judges were impressed at the wide age range and inclusion shown by the team. They felt that the robot had some very complex coding and showed innovative design, with the pneumatic lift device proving most popular!

The team achieved tenth place overall out of the 48 teams, which everyone was very happy with. Well done to all!
