

FROM THE VICAR

This year marks the five-hundredth anniversary of the start of the Reformation in continental Europe – a spiritual renewal movement that reached England a couple of decades later, thanks to Henry VIII's break with Rome over the controversial matter of his matrimonial ambitions. (The Church of England has long had the knack of doing the right thing for the wrong reasons, embarrassingly late.)

Originally intended quite literally as a 'reformation' – a reforming of a Catholic church that had become compromised theologically and politically – the movement actually led instead, of course, to a fundamental split between the western churches ... a split that continues to impede our Gospel witness to this day.

For all the sadness of that split, and our continuing hopes of a healing of the breach not only with Rome but also between the various different strands of reformed churches that have happened since, there is very much to celebrate in the insights of the Reformers and their contribution to our country's, and our churches', life.

Their translation of the Bible into English, and the reworking of Sunday services into participatory acts of worship in English rather than Latin (the beautiful translation that became our '1662' Prayer Book) sparked a spiritual movement that touched the nation, and individuals' lives, deeply. And the emphasis that they placed on the authority of scripture, and on individuals' response to God quite apart from any church or priestly mediation, laid the foundation for transformed lives ever since.

We shall be holding various events in CHEQS to mark the anniversary, including at least one Sunday service from the 1549 prayer book, using Tudor music. But to launch the celebration why not come and join us in Lechlade church on the evening of September 26th for *A Monk's Tale* – a "comedy for 2017 celebrating the 500th Anniversary of Martin Luther & his Ninety-Five Theses which debuted at the Edinburgh Fringe". The children's exhibition was a great hit. As the churchwarden wrote to them afterwards: "Thank you for the wonderful work the children produced. The rest was just stunning, what you can make out of old newspapers and glue is just amazing!!"

And the booksale sold about 2,500 books, raising more than £1,000 for church funds. John is already collecting more for two years' time, and sells all year round on the internet: so do continue to pass books (maps, DVDs, CDs etc) in his direction, along with packing materials for his postal sales.

COLN CHOIR



A STORY TO WARM YOUR HEARTS

A lovely story passed on by Patti Price

Canada has taken in a large number of refugees. Their unique approach is to encourage townships to sponsor a family or families whom locals commit to support and help integrate into the new life, country, culture and language for one year while the government provides financial support. The commitment is for one year only. Here is the story of one such township from my sister-in-law.

“I know those among you who live in the UK have reasons to fear Syrians but I want you to know of one success story.

“Fifty or so sponsors in Port Perry have been driving the three refugee dads and a couple of the mums to ESL (English as a Second language) lessons all winter. The children are all happily integrated into and loving school. Eyad now works for us in the garden. He, Kawan & Ahmad look as if they may have full-time jobs for the summer as has Ahmad's thirteen year old son (stacking shelves in the local supermarket). The younger boys will have swimming lessons and will continue playing soccer as they have been doing since spring arrived. They too will continue with ESL five days a week provided by volunteer teachers among the sponsors.

“All three families are loved and supported on a daily basis by three teams of volunteers who take them grocery shopping, teach them about on-line banking, help them obtain & use credit cards, will help them get driving licenses when the time comes. Dentists in town all donate much time to their extremely bad teeth, while doctors have all taken them on and provide them with free medication where possible. We all take the children on outings and generally look out for their welfare. We are lucky to have Arabic speakers among the community but otherwise resort to Google translator which can be quite hilarious on occasion!

“Our three families are all secular Muslims, one family is Kurdish and we have just learnt that the local Catholic church is expecting two Christian families any day now. Two of our friends in nearby Newcastle sponsored another family a year ago while the church sponsored his elderly parents. They are fully integrated into the Newcastle community, his sister has moved from the US to join them, he has started his own business, his wife has produced a recipe book in both Arabic & English and is running a catering business for the township. All this in a short twelve months.

“The joy on all sides is tangible – but they are missing their families, just as I missed mine when I first came to Canada. They have a huge support team and are very grateful for all we do. The local Catholic school board will continue the free ESL lessons locally when school begins again in the Fall.”

No money will be exchanged but packets need to be clearly marked with the name and collection date. You could also add any other useful growing tips. Unused seed packets can also be exchanged.

Some easy vegetables include beans, peas, tomatoes and spinach. Remember: no hybrids, dry seeds completely on the plants for most seeds, reduce cross-pollination by only growing one variety of each species and isolate by distance. Only save seeds from the healthiest true-to-type plants.






